COVID-19 OFFICE PROTOCOL

As you all know we closed the park office to all foot traffic back in March due to the pandemic, we were following CDC and State of Maine guidelines to keep residents and staff as safe as possible. We appreciate the support and patience you have given us during this time. We will continue offering limited contact trash bag purchases, rent payments, office support and demo invoice payments as we have via online, call in using your card on file and checks dropped off in night deposit box. Call ahead and the office will run your items out curbside for your convenience.

As businesses are opening again, we will open the office to limited foot traffic for more hands-on type of help, like lease signing, notarizing documents etc. with some guidelines and rules.

Starting July 15, 2020, we will be open by appointment only when necessary. For safety reasons we encourage residents to use our remote options whenever possible.

Masks are required to enter the Clubhouse.

Limited foot traffic, 1 to 2 people at a time, call ahead to plan for access availability.

Clubhouse will not be open for rental at this time.

Automatic payment plan, you authorize us to make your payment on a set day and account of your choice Lockbox at the Clubhouse for secure drop-off of rent

WATER

This month is a good time to check out your oil tank, for such issues as painting, possible leaks and that it is sitting properly on the legs and blocks.

Do you have demo to be removed? Set it by the curb and we'll remove it for a small fee.

Place limbs and brush at YOUR curbside for daily pickup, do not use the vacant lots to put these items on. Reminder: leaves must be bagged for daily pickup. This is a service we do to keep the park neat but leaves must be bagged for us to pick them up. Rule of thumb on bag weight, if you struggle to pick it up then maintenance staff will have trouble also. Keep bag weight manageable.

Residents are walking, riding bikes and jogging along the Community roadways. So please observe the Community speed limit of 15 mph!

Please be conservative when using sprinklers this hot and dry season. Put them on timers or make sure to they are not running 24/7. Thank you

Root Beer Tiramisu

Here's everyone's favorite Italian dessert reimagined with a flavor profile that's purely American. Like a root beer float sent to finishing school, this sweet will completely delight.

Ingredients

Three 20-ounce bottles root beer

Three 8-ounce containers mascarpone

1 1/2 cups confectioners' sugar

3 cups heavy cream

1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

About 36 ladyfingers or savoiardi

12 root beer barrel candies, finely crushed


Heat a large skillet over high heat. Add 1 1/2 bottles root beer and bring to a boil. Cook until syrupy and reduced to about 1/2 cup, 7 to 8 minutes. Cool completely, then cover and refrigerate.

Combine the mascarpone and 1 1/4 cups confectioners' sugar in a mixer fitted with the paddle attachment. Beat on medium just until smooth and light (do not overbeat). In another bowl, whip the cream and vanilla with the remaining 1/4 cup confectioners' sugar until it holds soft peaks. Fold about 1/4 of the cream into the mascarpone to lighten it, then fold in the remaining cream.

Pour the remaining 1 1/2 bottles root beer into an 8-inch square baking dish or other container for soaking the lady-fingers. Working with a few ladyfingers at a time, dip briefly in the root beer (just a few seconds to lightly saturate; don't over soak) and line the bottom of a trifle dish. Spread a quarter of the mascarpone mixture in an even layer over top. Sprinkle with a quarter of the crushed root beer barrels. Repeat with 2 more layers each of soaked ladyfingers, mascarpone and crushed root beer barrels. Make 1 final layer of soaked ladyfingers and a smooth layer of mascarpone on the top. Reserve the remaining crushed root beer barrels. Cover and refrigerate the tiramisu until well chilled, about 4 hours.

When ready to serve, sprinkle the top of the tiramisu with

the remaining crushed root beer barrels and drizzle with some root beer reduction. Scoop out portions into serving dishes and drizzle with the remaining root beer reduction.

HOME MAINTENANCE CORNER

CAN I PAINT THE VOG (VINYL COVERED GYPSUM) WALLBOARD IN A MOBILE HOME?

Yes, you can. But, to be sure that you successfully hide the printed pattern on the wallboard and that the paint adheres securely to the wall, it's important to take the time to clean and prime the surface first before applying your paint color.

Here's the steps to follow:

- 1. Clean the walls with a TSP or mild detergent solution. Then spackle any dings and areas of minor wall damage.
- 2. Apply two coats of a stain-hiding primer, such as Zinsser 1-2-3, allowing the manufacturer's recommended dry time between coats.
- 3. Apply two coats of paint. You might want to choose a paint with matte or flat for a matte finish.

We do not recommend removing the batten strips. The gap between boards has to be mudded with dry-wall joint compound, then sanded back flush to the adjacent wallboard surfaces, in order to eliminate the open seams. If you are a perfectionist, getting the seam line to completely disappear may drive you crazy. Applying a texture finish with a trowel and dry-wall mud over the entire wall surface is an alternative that eliminates some of the work trying o get the



joints perfectly smooth; but texturing takes time too, and may not be the look that you are after.

Preventing dehydration in your pets

In hot weather, your dog can overheat very easily, causing heat stroke. Be sure to have fresh cool water available for them at all times. If you take your pet hiking or out playing, you must not forget to bring along a jug of water, not only for yourself, but for your dog, too. They make some really neat water containers that can strap right onto your pets back, making it possible for them to carry their own water supply. You can find a variety of styles online. See sample photo below.

Never leave your dog or cat in the car on hot days, because they can overheat extremely quickly. Be sure your cats have plenty of fresh clean water, too. Providing a drinking fountain with running water or adding a couple ice cubes to the water bowl will sometimes encourage them to drink more water.
